**Que 2: What are the differences between old facilities and new facilities?**

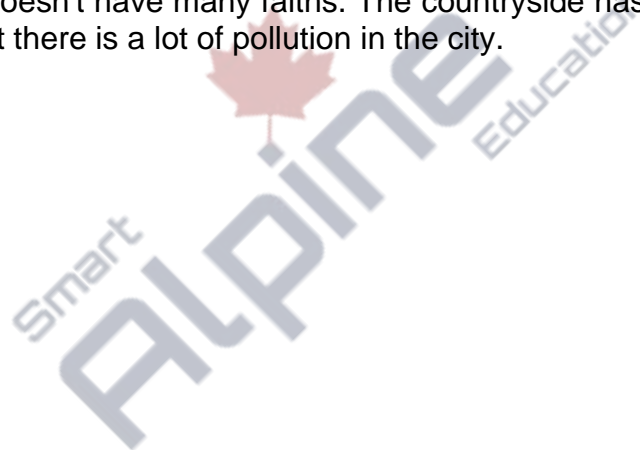

But in the south part of India, it is hot and humid, so light holiday fabrics are best, though jumpers, jackets, and jeans are useful in hill stations, which can get surprisingly cold. A good brimmed or sun hat works wonders. Some smarter South Indian bars/restaurants/clubs have strict dress codes – e.g. no sandals or shorts at most upmarket urban places.

For women, strappy tops, shorter dresses, and the like are fine in Goa, cosmopolitan Mumbai, tourist parts of Kerala, etc, but you'll need to cover up in most of Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, and beyond the main tourist hubs. Think baggy trousers or ankle-length skirts with non-revealing tops; shawls or dupattas to throw on; and salwar kameez (traditional dress like tunic and trouser combination for women) or kurtas with trousers. Err on the conservative side.
