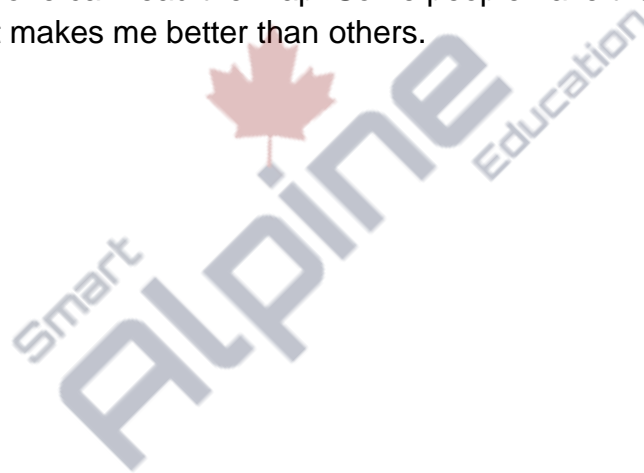
No, I rarely get lost because I make use of google maps whenever I decide to go to a new place. Always try to check my checklist time to time
